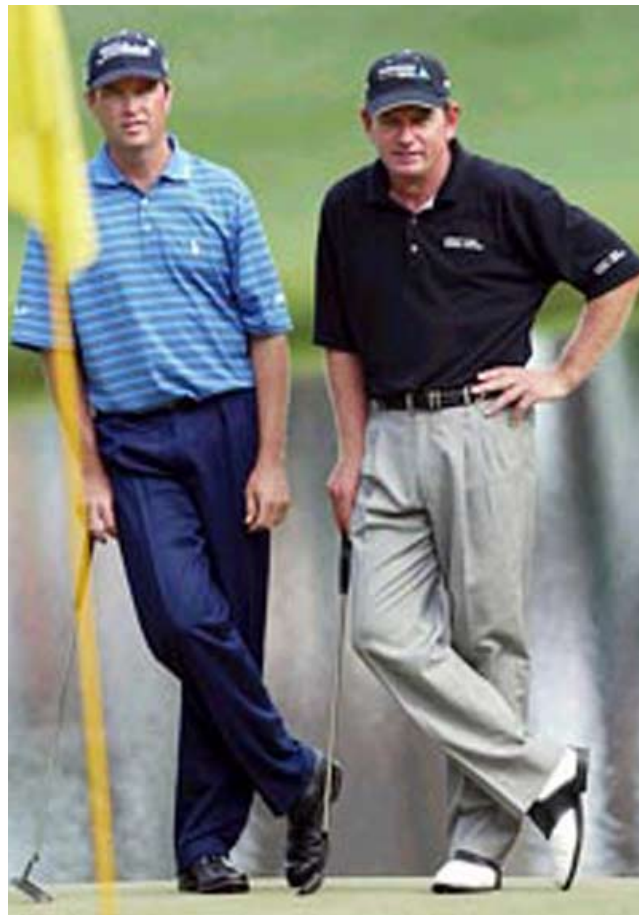




Price, right, and Love had close ties to victims of Sept. 11. The rebuilding continues ... And golf is a big part of the process at Sandler O'Neill
